
Lawrenceburg's art deco Crockett Theatre was built in 1950, complete with a custom-laid terrazzo lobby floor, and is one of the few theatres from this era still operating in the United States. It is listed on the National Historic Registry and has been lovingly refurbished by the Crockett Theatre Board.

Groups such as The Singing Carter Family with Mother Maybelle and the Carter girls have graced its stage. Reel-to-reel features such as Gone with the Wind, Smokey and the Bandit, and Elvis movies have entertained full houses. Many a child growing up in Lawrenceburg fondly remembers being on stage at the Theatre for dance recitals, band competitions, and other community events. Today, the stage is named to honor the work of Emmy Award-winning actor Michael Jeter, a native of Lawrenceburg, TN. It is actively used for performances and conferences.

The music of Historic RCA Studio B comes to life in a special holiday tour and concert by guitarist Meagan Taylor, great-niece of Chet Atkins, and pianist Jason Coleman, grandson of Floyd Cramer. Taylor and Coleman will perform Christmas classics as well as timeless songs, including Atkins's "Freight Train" and Cramer's "Last Date". Meagan and Jason's beautiful vocal harmonies, and a mix of pop, country, jazz, and intimate acoustic melodies bring an ear-pleasing variety to the holiday season. Many songs feature Meagan's thumbpicking guitar and Jason's slip note piano, harking back to the signature sound made famous by Meagan's uncle Chet Atkins and Jason's grandfather Floyd Cramer.

The Nashville Ballet brings a taste of Africa to the Crockett when they present The Singing Tortoise. This event is sponsored by the Junior Auxiliary of Lawrence County to promote reading for children with this education based performance. This West African folk tale, tells the tale of a hunter named Ama who meets a magical singing tortoise in the forest. He promises not to tell anyone about the tortoise's talent, but breaks his word and must face the consequences. Narration, whimsical costumes and traditional African masks make The Singing Tortoise a great introduction to dance. A true Tennessee work with its original musical score by Belmont University professor Todd London. The performance combines several artistic forms of expression, including: dance, music, art, and drama.

Ricky J Taylor & the Live Roots Ensemble create and perform music that includes elements of folk, traditional country, bluegrass and even chamber music. Based in Huntsville, Alabama, Ricky's songs are grounded in the southern traditions where music is sincere and born from matters of the heart.

Their original songs often reflect a universal search for meaning by illuminating the human condition; capturing emotions that are sincere, cathartic, sad or uplifting. All done through highly articulate lyrics and musical arrangements. They also feature traditional instrumental tunes. The current lineup formed in 2014, bringing together

a group of highly acclaimed musicians. Ricky has toured with notable artists including bluegrass great Claire Lynch.

THURSDAY, APRIL 6TH Fisk Jubilee Singers

The award-winning Fisk Jubilee Singers are vocal artists and students at Fisk University in Nashville, who sing and travel worldwide. The ensemble sings Negro spirituals around the world, allowing the group to share this rich culture globally while preserving this unique music.

The original Jubilee Singers introduced 'slave songs' to the world in 1871 and were instrumental in preserving this unique American musical tradition known today as Negro spirituals. They broke racial barriers in the US and abroad in the late 19th century and entertained Kings and Queens in Europe. At the same time, they raised money in support of their beloved school.

In 2008, the Fisk Jubilee Singers were selected as a recipient of the 2008 National Medal of Arts, the nation's highest honor for artists and patrons of the arts.
